



# Albert Einstein Academy Title 1 Plan

## Overview

Albert Einstein Academy is a community school located in northeast Ohio with two campuses serving approximately 360 students. These campuses include Lakewood 6-12, and Strongsville k-12. There are approximately 30 homeroom teachers, 3 title teachers, 6 intervention specialists, and 3 school counselors employed by the district.

## Mission

AEA is a welcoming and diverse district that provides a comprehensive and rigorous educational environment with resources, programming, and support for all students regardless of race, religion, sexual orientation, or gender identity.

## Program Components

- ❖ Reading services students in Literacy with a primary focus on grades K-6
- ❖ Math services students with a primary focus on grades 1-7
- ❖ Title 1 supports the students' work in the regular education program. Title 1 is "in addition to" the regular classroom instruction, not in place of that Instruction.
- ❖ We follow an early intervention model for our service in reading and math. PREVENTION is key.
- ❖ Students qualify for the program based upon a multi-criteria process that includes several assessments. STARS, STARS Phonics, District Quarterly assessment, CMBs, and Classroom data. Students do not qualify for Title 1 based upon one assessment only.
- ❖ Upon qualification, a parent notification/permission letter will be sent out.
- ❖ Services will be provided on a semester basis with the exception of newly enrolled students who can be placed in the program based on need and available space.
- ❖ Title Reading and Math specialists will service up to 30 students per building. Students should receive between 30-60 mins per week of intervention
- ❖ Through their time in the title, one program families will receive monthly progress reports from their assigned specialists.
- ❖ Specialists should attend TBT meetings as necessary to report on student evidence and data based on current RTI in place
