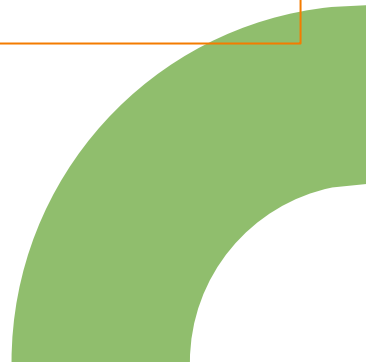




Title One Services

AEA is a welcoming and diverse district that provides a comprehensive and rigorous educational environment with resources, programming, and support for all students regardless of race, religion, sexual orientation, or gender identity.

What is Title One?

The purpose of Title I is to provide all children “significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and to close educational achievement gaps.”

At AEA title provides pull out small group instruction in reading grades k-6th and math grades 1-7, students receive 60-90 mins weekly.

Services run on a semester long basis.

Student Qualification

Students qualify for the program based upon a multi-criteria process that includes several assessments.

- STARS Reading or Math
- District Quarterly Standards assessment
- Prior years state test scores
- CMB (curriculum based measures)
- STARS Phonics
- Classroom data.

Students do not qualify for Title 1 based upon one assessment only.

What can you expect?

AEA recognizes that parents are an important part of their child's academic success. Research indicates that when parents are involved in their child's education, children have better attendance, achieve better grades, learn strong social and behavioral skills that help them throughout life, and continue their education beyond high school.

- Notification of qualification for title services
- Assessment score reports 3 times per year for STARS
- monthly progress reports from their assigned specialists on mastery of skills and progress along with suggestions for continues practice at home.
- Opportunity to meet with title teachers during school conferences
- Notification of program completion
- Email or phone communication as needed



Changes to the Third Grade Reading Guarantee (TGRG) House bill 33

New TGRG protocol

- All students from grades k-6th grade screened in tier 1 screener within the first 30 days of school
- New enrollment must be screened in the tier 1 screener within 30 days of enrollment
- Any student determined at risk from the tier one screener needs a letter sent to parents with scores and notification of progress monitoring
- Tier 2 screeners administered to students at risk based on multiple factors.
- Results of tier two screen shared with families, if the student is at risk for dyslexia based on scores information of reading development and risk factors of dyslexia sent with a score report with recommendation for outside testing for possible diagnosis.
- Rimps (reading improvement/monitoring) plan put in place for all students k-4th grade who score in the 40th percentile or below on tier 1 screener *Please note one grade per year will be added for RIMP monitoring*
- Any 3rd-grade student who does not pass the TGRG test within the school year is promoted to 4th but must receive 90 mins of pull-out intensive 1:1 or small group tutoring per week for a total of 50 hours in 36 weeks
